

Marion Flagg Scholarship Program

Named for one of PCACAC's most outstanding members, the Marion Flagg Scholarship is awarded annually to a group of exceptional educational professionals who are not currently members of PCACAC. The Human Relations Committee oversees the selection of the scholarship recipients. Most of these colleagues work with minority populations or students from disadvantaged backgrounds. They may be high school counselors, two- or four-year college admission professionals, independent counselors or individuals working in such programs as "I Have a Dream," "GEAR UP" and "Upward or College Bound."

Ann Powell Mentoring Program

The Ann S. Powell Memorial Mentoring Program is open to new college counseling professionals (defined as fewer than five years experience) from within the region served by PCACAC—Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia and the District of Columbia. PCACAC developed this program to serve as an outreach to counselors and schools who may not know about PCACAC. The Ann Powell Mentoring Program is designed to enable participants to:

- Grow professionally by attending regional and national conferences devoted to college admission.
- Build professional relationships and develop a support network.
- Come to a deeper understanding of the college admission process.
- Help students navigate the college choice and application processes more effectively.
