

General Membership Meeting Minutes PCACAC 49th Annual Spring Conference – Richmond, VA April 29, 2014

The meeting was called to order by Mike Carter, President, at 10:55 am with approximately 110 people in attendance.

The Minutes of the September 2013 General Membership meeting were approved by voice vote, following a motion from Kathleen Martin and a second from Geoff Smith.

President's Report, Mike Carter
