Scholars Program

Provide Scholars with a wealth of academic, social, and financial assistance in preparation for college admission and graduation.

Currently serving over 240 Scholars (high school and college), primarily first-generation, low-income students (eight partner high schools -Montgomery County, MD and Washington, DC)

Services include:

- Curriculum planning and weekly standardized test prep
- Workshops on skills including time management, study skills, etc.
- Targeted visits to college campuses and college rep visits/sessions
- Testing and college application fee support
- Creation of tailored college lists developed in collaboration with scholars and families
- College application assistance including writing support
- Assistance applying for and negotiating financial aid
- Ongoing support and leadership training throughout college

89% graduation rate, 5x the national average for low-income college students.



COLLEGIATE DIRECTIONS

Wellness Program

Our wellness team meets with every high school scholar to help them address and work through issues such as academic-related anxiety, problems balancing family responsibilities with schoolwork, grief, etc.

- 75% of all lifetime mental disorders in most studies start by the mid-20s Early intervention is key!
- Academic impact if untreated:
 - Decline in GPA
 - Discontinued enrollment
 - Leaving school

Career Mentoring Initiative

Provide mentoring, in college and beyond, with a focus on career coaching and access to workforce opportunities through experiential learning and by connecting them with accomplished professionals in their chosen fields.

 Access to opportunities, networking, resources, and community in virtual format

School Support Program

Program utilizes our knowledge and expertise to work with high school staff and administrators, providing context-specific coaching to schools to create or strengthen their college advising programs.

- Served more than 800 students and family members directly.

Community Bridges (CB) was initially established in 1997 as an after-school Enrichment Program for MS girls in MCPS with a focus on empowering girls from low income and immigrant families to become leaders in their community

CB has evolved into an integrated 4th thru 12th grade after and out-of-school program focusing on social/emotional skill building, leadership development, community engagement, academic success, and college access and completion.

The CBHS Program serves over 120 HS girls attending Montgomery Blair, Springbrook, Northwood, Paint Branch, Einstein, Gaithersburg, Blake & Kennedy High Schools, providing weekly in school program and the opportunity for out-of-school experiences (visits to Maryland Statehouse, theatres, ice skating, sporting events, museums, as well as area colleges.



- CBHS girls are primarily 1st gen students taking Honors, AP/IB or dual enrollment classes
- Over 80% of CB students' parents were born outside the US; many students grow up in multilingual households
- Hallmarks: civic minded, family & community focused
- Majority are Pell eligible; MHEC grant eligible
- Mentoring opportunity after 1 year enrollment



Our College Access Program is offered to all CB juniors and includes:

- Summer college preparation worksessions
- Group financial aid informational sessions for senior parents
- One-on-one support for applying to college, financial aid and scholarships
- Visits to colleges for admitted students days
- Financial aid package comparison

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We reach over 4,000 high school students and over 700 college students every year. We actively advise 60% of Baltimore City Schools' seniors and 25% of Baltimore City Schools' graduates attending a 4-year college on a Pell Grant.

Innovative & Experiential


Onsite and virtual advising and on-going data tracking provide flexibility to respond to an everchanging landscape.




