





Care




- Know (and be comfortable/confident with) your role

 - "Advocacy" does not always work here
 - Equity and Access can be a great conversation starter
 - Build a working relationship with the parent and student

 - counseling session to complete first application


Connect

Encourage




- Conversations with each other

Support the Application Process



CACA

- Help families understand admissions deadlines and policies (ED, EA, RD, Rolling)
- Help families understand different types of applications (CA, Coalition, College-Specific, etc)
- Help families understand the requirements of an application
- Clearly communicate process for requesting documents and recommendations
- Provide opportunities and resources for FAFSA Completion
- Continue to support
- Continue to communicate with college admissions representatives

- Encourage families to focus on Best Fit (including Financial Fit)
- Continue to support

Remind


